

"Edisto Road Show" A Success

ore than 500 people turned out for the Land Trust's first "Edisto Road Show" weekend, and it was I fabulous fun and deliciously decadent. On Friday night, the Edisto Road Show Soiree was held at Cedar Hall plantation overlooking the expansive marsh of Russell Creek. Rain was in the air, but not a drop fell on the party, and the excitement was palpable under the big tent as the live auction swung into high gear. Artwork, trips, antiques and oriental rugs were sold by auctioneer, Pat Hamilton, elegant

cuisine was served by Southern Affairs Catering, and live music by the John Tecklenburg trio was enjoyed. Guests departed with treasures and memories of a spectacular evening.

On Saturday, festival attendees came to Jane Edwards School and brought their heirlooms and curiosities for assessment by eight of the State's best appraisers, who donated their time and expertise: Dr. John Bryan, Dr. Jack Meyer, Ron Bridwell, Pat Hamilton, Dr. Roger Stroup, Frank Sarnowski, Jr., Holly McGee Roberts, and Carroll

McGee. All day there was a steady stream of valuable and unusual objects, including jewelry made of

human hair, a signed Audubon print of a Brown Pelican, a late 18th century miniature portrait on ivory of a member of the Middleton family, an English Pre-Raphaelite table, rare porcelain, and much more. Lunch was served to the crowd, and many shopped at the vendors' booths for wearable art, sea grass baskets, paintings and oriental rugs. Dozens of door prizes were given away to lucky winners.

In addition to the generosity of the appraisers, many others contributed to the Road Show's success - Executive Director Brailsford said, "This success was measured in several ways. One of the most important was the galvanizing

of an army of community volunteers, without whose hard work and expertise, this event could not have happened." They have nicknamed the Land Trust volunteers, "Roadies," and there will be a special

FROM THE DIRECTOR



Cindy Baysden, Executive Director of Beaufort Open Land Trust, and I were recently interviewed by Walter Edgar on his radio show — topic "viewpoints on preserving land and scenic views in the SC Lowcountry." It was a wonderful opportunity to spread the word about our proactive work to save a disappearing way of life; and the following highlights are from this interview.

Walter Edgar: How much land is permanently protected on Edisto Island?

Marian: Approximately 8,000 acres is protected, if you include the State Park land and Botany Bay Plantation, which has been willed to the SC DNR and hopefully will never be developed. This is in addition to acquisitions and easements held by EIOLT, TNC, Ducks Unlimited and Low Country Open Land Trust, which will be permanently preserved. The Edisto Island Open Land Trust focuses on Edisto Island exclusively because it is such a special place – in many ways it resembles the SC Coast 30 years ago, and we have a narrow window of opportunity to keep it that way.

Walter Edgar: There's a lot of misunderstanding about what land trusts do – people think you are opposed to private property rights, and that donating conservation easements entails giving up all rights to their land.

Cindy: On the contrary, land trusts respect landowners' private property rights and each tract preserved is done through voluntary cooperation between the landowner and the land trust...

Marian: Land protection is usually initiated by the property owner – to preserve land he loves for now and for future generations. A landowner does not give up title to his property with an easement – only the right to subdivide it. He

continues to own the property and use it in all the traditional ways, such as hunting or farming. When title passes to a descendant or to a but the conservation easement goes with it.

Walter Edgar: With farmland and open space disappearing at a rapid rate throughout the country, how are you doing in your areas? Are you winning the battle?

Cindy: We are making progress, but we cannot slow down – the threat to our coast is dire. We must be vigilant – you can't just throw up your hands when you see yet another commercial building going up in your area –get active in your local land trust!

Marian: People who love the land are becoming empowered. They now recognize that government is not going to save the land from sprawl – we have to do it ourselves by giving voice to our vision of what our future landscape should be, voting for political candidates who are sympathetic, and by each setting aside his own property for protection, if that property could be threatened. People now realize that if a majority doesn't insist on planned growth, our communities may someday face a natural disaster like Katrina.

Brailsford Appointed to ACE Basin NERR Committee

The EIOLT has a policy of collaboration with like-minded stakeholders intent upon preserving the natural heritage of the ACE Basin and Edisto Island, which is encompassed within the Basin's eastern edge. Recently Director Brailsford was invited to serve on the ACE Basin National Estuarine Research Reserve (ACE Basin NERR) Advisory Committee. The third largest reserve in the nation, the ACE Basin was designated as a National Estuarine Research Reserve by NOAA in 1992.

The mission of the ACE Basin NERR, managed by the SC Department of Natural Resources, is to protect the natural beauty, abundant wildlife and unique cultural heritage of the area. Their work involves education, management, research and stewardship of this pristine area. Brailsford said "It is an honor to be a part of the work of the ACE Basin NERR, which overlaps perfectly with the mission of the Edisto Island Open Land Trust."

The ACE Basin NERR Advisory Committee met at the Edisto Island Interpretive Center on October 6 and is working on an update to the original management plan approved in 1992. The plan articulates visions, goals, and priorities, and accuracy public involvement in the management processes. The committee
