

## Two New Properties Protected By EIOLT

EIOLT is delighted to have been selected as the steward for two properties now protected by conservation easement. Thank to conservation-minded landowners, like Mike Low and Randall Swan, more and more of Edisto's natural landscape is being saved for future generations to enjoy and care for.

### Conservation Easement on Manse Road

**A**s a teenager, Randall Swan came to Edisto Island to go camping. Today he and his family still enjoy the unspoiled woods, creeks and vast stretches of farm fields as well as the rich traditions and history of this wonderful place.

Randall recently decided to do what he could to prevent future clearing of the woods and natural areas on his four-acre Edisto Island tract fronting Store Creek. His donation of a conservation easement on this property, which has one residence tucked into the natural landscape, forever protects the scenic views from Store Creek as well as from Manse Road.



In the Nike commercial, Randall's advice to other landowners considering a conservation easement is, "just do it." He adds "doing what one can to preserve Edisto is worth the effort . . . the Edisto Island Open Land Trust is very helpful (with the easement process)." The EIOLT is honored to assume the responsibility for stewarding this beautiful property.



### Conservation Easements on Russell Creek Road

**W**hen asked about what lies ahead for Edisto Island 100 years from now, Michael Low responded with a hopeful vision of Edisto still being a place of great natural beauty. Michael's donation of a conservation easement on 41 acres of his property along Russell Creek Road sets an example for other landowners.

Growing up spending time roaming Edisto's natural and wild spaces led to Michael's love of Edisto and his decision to preserve two contiguous tracts that front Sand Creek. These side-by-side easements protect a very diverse natural habitat — the marsh edge buffers and expansive maritime forests provide a home to migratory and wading birds and other wildlife, as well as to many species of plants.

Michael believes people are starting to realize that Edisto is not only a place but also a way of life. He thinks that the desire to preserve this quality of life for future generations is gaining momentum. Michael's advice to other potential donors is to place a conservation easement on your land now and take advantage of the expanded tax incentives that are scheduled to expire at the end of this year. Donating a conservation easement provides a way to make a difference in Edisto's future, still maintain control over your property and get financial rewards for relinquishing negotiated development rights.

### 2007 is THE Year to Protect Your Land

Never before and quite possibly never again will the economic incentives for land conservation be so beneficial for eligible landowners. The expanded federal income tax incentives for a landowner who donates a conservation easement

## **FROM THE DIRECTOR**

**H**ave you wondered where the extra 1% you pay in Charleston County Sales Tax goes? We hope it will go right back into Edisto Island's scenic and rural landscape. Charleston County recently announced an opportunity to apply for \$67 Million in funding from the Greenbelt Bank Board to purchase conservation easements on rural lands.

The EIOLT has negotiated the purchase of three conservation easements on adjoining Edisto properties, and we have submitted three applications to the Greenbelt Bank Board for one-half the funds needed. For the other half of the easements purchase cost, we also submitted three requests for funding to the SC Conservation Bank.

These three adjoining properties total almost 400 acres of scenic farmland, woodlands and wetlands that connect to several other already preserved properties in the northwestern quadrant of Edisto Island. These connected lands will provide an uninterrupted habitat of several thousand acres, which support diverse wildlife, including threatened species such as bald eagles, wood storks, and Painted Bunting.

Whatever the funding outcome, a number of people deserve thanks for helping EIOLT staff accomplish the tight deadline for these six funding applications: board members - Sue Thornton, David Lybrand, Lex Crawford, BoBo Lee, Ellen Unger, and Chuck Callahan; volunteers - Pam Jacobs and Jim Brailsford; and two expert volunteers - David Martin of Martin Appraisals & Forestry, Inc., and Matthew Kizer of Edisto Sales & Rentals Realty. Also board member, Nancy Sandel, and volunteer, Lois Anderson, kept the EIOLT Tomato Festival event on track so that the staff could concentrate on land protection. It really does take a community to preserve a special place!

## **Changes at EIOLT**

Sue Hay Thornton was elected to the EIOLT Board of Trustees at the March Board Meeting. Sue and her husband, Adrian Chandler, live in Charleston and spend weekends at their Edisto Beach getaway. Sue's family is from Charleston but she grew up in Rhode Island, graduated from Boston University, and then came back to SC to attend the University of South Carolina School of Law. She practiced law in Charleston for 15+ years, specializing in real estate law. Sue has been actively involved in environmental and community work, including serving on the board of the International Birds of Prey and volunteering with the SC Bar's Heirs Property Project. With the EIOLT's accelerating land protection efforts, Sue experience and knowledge will be indispensable to the Land Trust.

The EIOLT would like to express appreciation to two board members whose terms on the board have expired – William F. Thompson, Jr., and Edward K. Pritchard, III – for their service to the Land Trust. Pat Neumann, has recently left her position as the Land Trust's Land Protection Director, and is currently helping with land protection projects on a consulting basis. Pat's on-going support and expert assistance is greatly appreciated.

## **Grants Support EIOLT Land Preservation Work**

The Town of Edisto Beach has again approved funding for the Highway 174 Beautification project. Since 1998, the Town of Edisto Beach has provided Accommodations Tax funding to the EIOLT for litter-removal along Highway 174. All these A-Tax funds go to a contractor who annually picks up more than 12 tons of litter. Additional A-Tax funds have recently been approved for EIOLT's Tomato Festival Street Dance on June 30. The EIOLT greatly appreciates the Town of Edisto Beach's support.

The Gaylord and Dorothy Donnelley Foundation has awarded a two-year grant to support the EIOLT's land protection, public education and general operations. The grant provides \$35,000 for 2007 and \$25,000 for 2008. Each year's grant is contingent upon raising matching new membership funds – either from higher levels of support by current members

# Scenic 174 Corridor Management Plan Update

The Scenic 174 Coalition is beginning work on the draft of the Corridor Management Plan for Highway 174, based on the research done by community members. Here are examples of 350 photos were taken by 29 participants who recorded their commer-

Here is a brief summary of the community's desires for the Corridor's future:

**Protect** - local family vendors and markets, our ancient trees and live oak canopy, the quirkiness of the island, our wildlife habitat and farmlands, the natural and scenic views, and our historic churches and structures.

**Prevent** - dock proliferation and inappropriate commercial structures.

**Promote** - keeping the road two lanes, natural buffer screening along the edges of road, bike paths, and more sites for islanders to display and sell art, crafts vegetables and seafood, and balanced growth and preservation.

**Fix** - signs pollution, litter, speed limits that are too high, highway design flaws, rundown structures, and make safer fishing and crabbing access to creeks.

## Painted Bunting Project

The EIOLT has embarked on an educational project to increase awareness about the threat to one of our most beautiful native birds – the Painted Bunting. If you have seen a brilliant flash of red, blue and yellow in the treetops, then you have witnessed the male bunting with the most distinctive coloring of any songbird in North America.

The Painted Bunting, which lives and breeds in the coastal regions of South Carolina, N.C., Georgia and Florida, is experiencing a steep decline in population (approximately a 60% loss over the last 40 years) that many attribute to the loss of habitat caused by expanding coastal development. That's where the EIOLT's efforts to preserve Edisto's woods, fields and marshes comes in. Concerned scientists from four states have formed the "Painted Bunting Working Group," and they are establishing habitat sites to promote breeding of the bunting.

With the help of the teaching staff at Jane Edwards and Edisto Beach Schools, the EIOLT is involving local school children in the effort to stop the decline in the Painted Bunting population. Learning activities for the children include making their own birdfeeders, for which the Land Trust will supply millet seed, the bunting's favorite food. On April 20 Lex Glover of the SC Department of Natural Resources will make a presentation at each of the Edisto schools about the plight of this bird, what the state is doing and how the children can help. Artist Bonnie Lee's painting of the bunting will be printed on T-shirts and given to each of the schoolchildren at the end of DNR's presentations. The T-shirts have been donated by board member Kathy Ravenel of Ravenel and Associates,) to give each child a "memory" for a lifetime.
