For Land's Sake!

A Look Back at the Beginning

Twenty years ago, the Edisto Island Open Land Trust was only an idea to protect the views and vistas on Edisto Island for future generations to enjoy. A few members of the Charleston County Comprehensive Land Use Committee (CCCLU) were becoming aware of the need to work with developers to ensure the landscape would remain intact. After several CCCLU conversations, a small group was created, led by Jenks Mikell. He researched other land trusts in the area in order for the process to begin for the establishment of a land trust to protect Edisto Island. The by-laws from the Beaufort Land Trust were used as a pattern and the trust was on the way to becoming a reality. In November 1994, the Edisto Island Open Land Trust received our federal exemption approval and the land trust was officially established. Our first office consisted of a cardboard box carried around in the trunks of our cars!

The first task at hand was to begin preserving land either by fee simple purchase or by holding voluntary conservation easements. Dr. and Mrs. Ritchie Belser generously hosted one of our first events at Sunny Side Plantation with Robert Marvin, noted landscape architect, as our speaker. With a large turnout at this event, our membership was growing and interest was spreading about the

Views and Vistas Preservation Project. Before long, the trust was able to purchase property on Highway 174 which began our effort to secure the open space necessary to preserve the quality of Edisto Island. Because of the conservation work that has been done by a number of groups working together over the years, Edisto has over 50% of the Island land preserved to date. The spectacular view up and across the Dawhoo can largely be attributed to the efforts made by our land trust.

Good development combined with strategic conservation is important for any community. My property is protected with a conservation easement that preserves the views and vistas for the next owner. I have been involved with the Edisto Island Open Land Trust for 20 years, hopefully helping Edisto retain its natural beauty. We have indeed progressed significantly in 20 years' time from a cardboard box to our office located on National Scenic Byway 174 with a full time Executive Director and another full time staff member and I am thrilled to have been a part of the important conservation work we have all done.

Historic Middleton Plantation Property Preserved



The Edisto Island Open Land Trust (EIOLT) added one more exciting conservation project to our inventory of protected properties at the end of 2013. The Clarkson Family placed a conservation easement on Middleton Plantation, agreeing to restrict any future development on the historic 100-acre property. Thanks to the Clarksons' generosity and the financial support from the Charleston County Greenbelt program, this iconic location on Store Creek will be preserved forever!

The protection of Middleton Plantation goes beyond its immediate waters. The conservation easement, by restricting future development and additional impervious surfaces, prevents future sources of non-point pollution, sedimentation, and noise/light disturbance. This, in turn, protects Store Creek, St. Pierre Creek, and the South Edisto River estuary.

There is a great deal of cultural significance to this property as well. Conserving our standing plantation homes on Edisto Island helps residents and visitors understand and experience an important part of our heritage by providing a living exhibit of our past. Ensuring that the remaining acreage surrounding the historic home at Middleton will not be developed is an important part of the public benefit of this project. EIOLT is committed to further land conservation on Edisto Island, and more willing landowners like the Clarksons combined with continued financial support from land trust members and business donors will help ensure more of Edisto is protected for our future generations to enjoy.

Middleton has been in our family for over 110 years. My mother grew up here and loved this place. Her dream was to have the house and the yard stay intact and in the family for as long as possible. Stephanie and

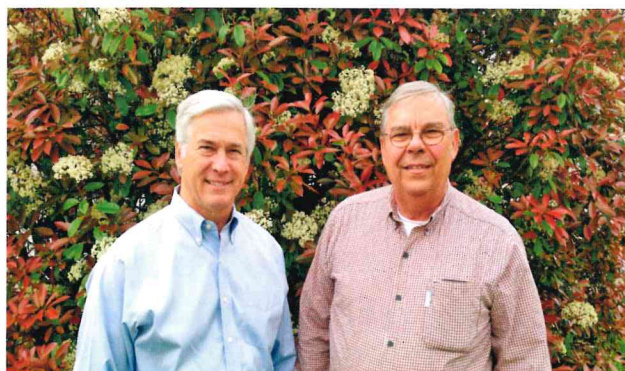

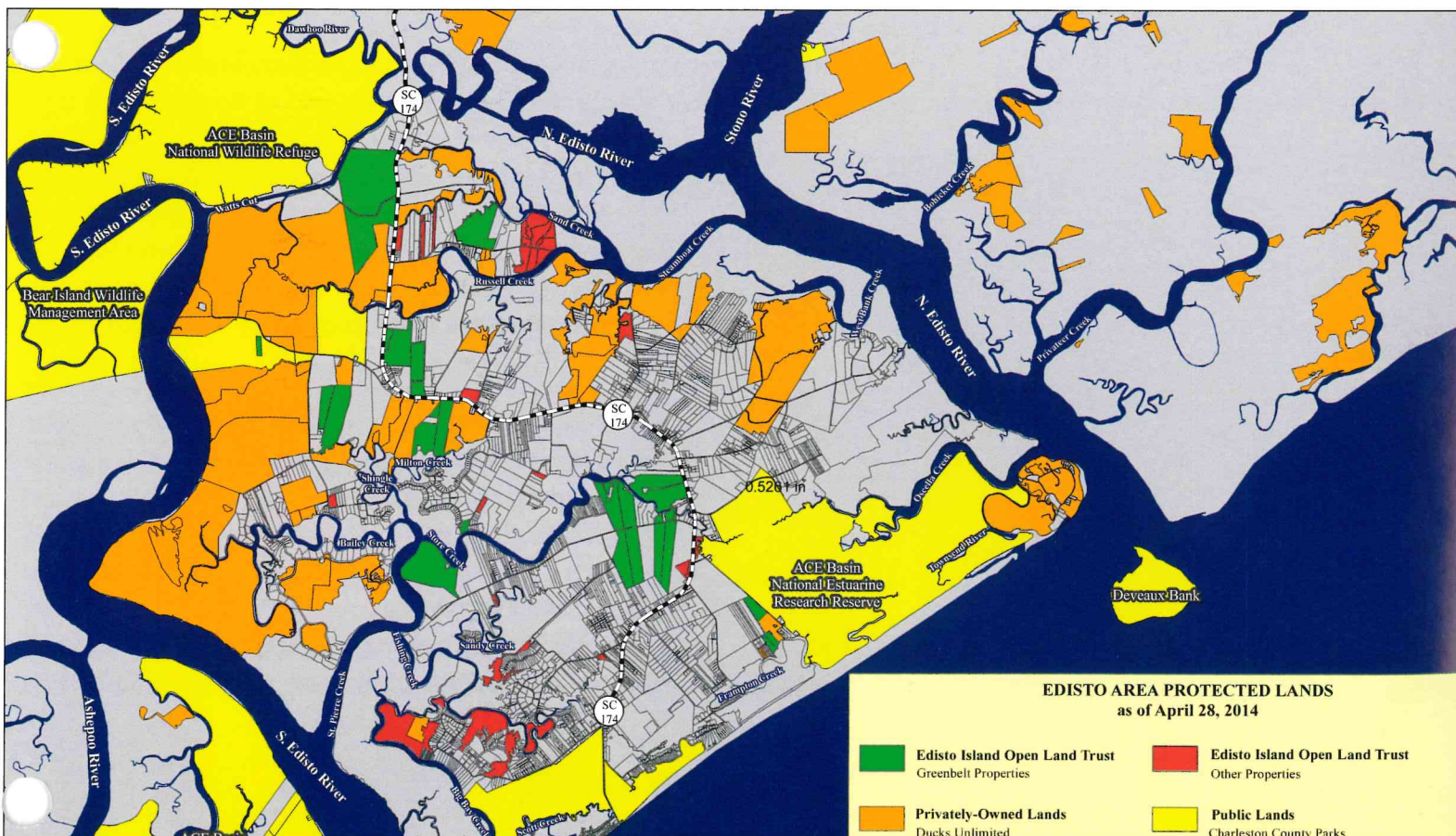
Our Partners in the Greening of Edisto Island

Nine years ago, Charleston County voters approved a ½ cent sales tax measure and the bond referendum that followed, to provide in part, grant funds for preserving green space in the County including rural lands and farms. In 2007 the Charleston County Green Fund was launched. EIOILT was eagerly one of the initial land trusts in line for the first cycle of Greenbelt grants in 2007, and by end of that first round, we were successful in securing grant funding to purchase conservation easements on three tracts, comprising 400 acres of Edisto farmland and forests. One of these was a threatened tract that had been approved for imminent subdivision development, and another was a farmland tract that was preserved in partnership with The Nature Conservancy. That first year ever since, the South Carolina Conservation Bank has been a critical partner in providing additional funds for leveraging the Greenbelt funding on EIOILT's projects.

At the end of 2013, over 3,400 acres on Edisto Island had been placed under conservation easement as a result of Greenbelt funding. Following were the tracts of land that EIOILT was successful in preserving, with the help of both Greenbelt and South Carolina Conservation Bank funds, and half of these projects were closed in the year 2009:

Edisto Island sits within the easternmost edge of the ACE Basin, an estuarine basin fed by the Ashepoo, Combahee, and Edisto Rivers. EIOILT is a member of the ACE Basin Task Force, which is a small group of land trusts and conservation non-profits, public agencies, and private landowners who have collaborated to preserve over 200,000 acres in the ACE Basin Project. EIOILT Task Force partners were successful in acquiring Greenbelt funding to preserve seven Edisto tracts over the last few years. All of these lands are under conservation easement which is the most cost-effective way for lands to be preserved with public funding. Easements are also an option that gives landowners continued ownership and use of the land, while providing excellent financial benefits for the development rights relinquished. One Edisto landowner who sold many of his development rights, now held in an easement with EIOILT, was quoted as saying it was "the best decision I've ever made." Not only did he receive some payment for the easement (partial value), but he was able to write off the remainder of the easement's appraised value on his annual tax returns; AND he had the peace of mind of knowing that his land will always be protected as a family farm and landscape of natural beauty.
